BUFFALO HORN TRAIL CLEARING

Crew clears a slug of trails July 29-30:

Score for the 2-day clearing was 67 trees, 1 bridge repair, 2 moose and 3 bears

Monday, July 29: Our crew of 8 split into two groups and went separate routes to clear trails out of the Buffalo Horn trailhead. Dick Haines (with packhorse), Jane Huffine, Bonnie Hammer and Jan Elpel traveled trails #560, #161 and #100 before meeting the other group on #57; later they split to head up #39 pas the Buffalo Horn cabin. That group cut 22 trees on their 15.5 mile journey and saw two moose near the cabin. Meanwhile Ron Rassley (with packhorse), Kay Tate and Ron and Sherrie White covered trails #1 and #57 before joining up with the second crew. Ron, Sherrie and Ron Rassley later completed trail #199 toward Elk Ridge before returning home after cutting 55 trees on that day.

Tuesday, July 30: Ron Rassley (with packhorse), Kay Tate, Bonnie Hammer and Ron and Sherrie White rode to Ramshorn Lake on trail #1, then continued up to the ridge on #164 and back out on Buffalo Horn Pass #1, clearing 12 trees. A group of riders had reported a bad spot on a bridge on the trail to the lake, so the group stopped to replace some rotting timbers and fill in a hole on that bridge. On the way home from the 13.25 mi. trek, the group spotted 3 black bears (mama and two cubs) running through a meadow in front of them.




