POKER RIDE



May 19: 7 members of GVBCH met at Spanish Crk TH and split into two groups. Rich, Connie, Mark and Tom worked their way up Trail 410 toward Pioneer Falls. The trail there was mostly clear but above the Falls there was quite a mess. Trees down, brush, etc. They worked through that, cutting 13 or so trees and back to the trailhead around 4 pm.

Wayne, Dan M. and Lew worked their way up Trail 407 toward Mirror Lake and encountered quite a few trees down across the trail. We cut 48 trees and made it to the 2nd crossing bridge by about 2:30 and turned back, arriving at the trailhead just behind Rich and his crew. SATURDAY TRAIL CLEARING

May 22: Tom and I put in a great 3 ½ hours on the Asbestos Creek trail today. The snow had stopped and the temperature was perfect for getting out in the woods. We trimmed shrubs, pruned overhanging limbs, and removed a few dead trees impacting the trail for approximately 1 mile. The trail is an easy hike to that point and we hope to get back up there next week to trim the next mile (or two) before riding in to tackle the upper more challenging stretch later this summer.

Lew, Tom, Marianne and myself met at Spanish Creek Campground for a day of trail work. The campground was deserted except for a group of 4 hunters planning a Spring bear hunt from the parking lot, of unfamiliar territory. I advised them to go up the 407 towards Falls Creek and we decided to take on Little Hell Roaring trail since the snow would hamper work on water bars on the 407. It was noted that the post holding the sign to Little hellroaring was broken and leaning up against the FS Poster board...a project we might take on during National Trails Day on 6/5.

Leaving the trailhead at 9:30 am with a crosscut, 2 silkys, and 4 loppers we worked up the trail until noon, ate a peaceful lunch on the trail, then continued on, leaving several snags deemed too dangerous to deal with, but clearing most along the way and removing limbs and brush encroaching on the trail as well. We worked until 3:00 pm before returning to the trailhead, meeting only one couple on the trail the entire day that was looking for Pioneer Falls. I gave them directions to the foot bridge and up the 407 to the falls.

The "official" count made by Marianne, with assistance from Lew, was 35 saw cuts. Back at the trailhead we also took a close look at the damage to the corrals. It appears that the damage can easily be repaired on National Trails Day as well. The only "wildlife" we encountered were several deer and scattered bull bison feeding on the Turner Ranch.

All in all it was a great day with perfect weather for trail work, plenty of fresh air, and a rewarding time with friends in the mountains. —Dan Porter

SATURDAY TRAIL CLEARING

May 29: Lew, Mark, and I met at Spanish Creek with plans to walk in the 401 with combies "at ready". I gave out several first pages of the May newsletter to horse owners camped at the trailhead and received good response. I also deployed the "Trail maintenance today" sign next to my truck and several people stopped by to thank us before and after the day. Several are good prospects to be new members.

We hiked in approximately 3 miles up the 401, clearing and repairing water bars as needed, doing some light trimming, and clearing a few deadfall as well. We stopped at 1pm in a small meadow for lunch and were greeted by a "Hummingbird moth" feeding on the nectar of "Spring Beauties". Lew and Mark had never seen one. Google "Hummingbird moth" if you haven't either.

Mark headed back at 3pm . Lew and I worked for another hour, returning to the trailhead around 5pm. Everyone we met was very appreciative of our efforts. One talked with me for an hour about trail work, and the advantages of using an "electric" chainsaw versus gas powered.

It was a great day to be in the mountains, with very light user traffic and perfect weather.

Stay tuned for updates from Lew on the plan for this coming Wednesday and be ready to ride next Saturday, National Trails Day, when Curt is bringing a pack horse and the plan is to ride in the 410 past the falls to snowline if possible. Trail work will only include clearing any deadfall that block the trail. If we reach the switchbacks overgrown with alders we will clear them out and ride on as well, or return as time allows.
