As most of you know, I ride 12 months out of the year. As soon as the weather cools, I switch my spurs to my warmer boots. They are waterproof, lined, very warm, and have great traction for ice and snow. However, the "footprint" is much larger.

When mounting and even more so when dismounting, I only insert the tip of my toe. Why? They are bigger around and take up most of the space in my stirrup. While there is still room in my stirrups, with the added thickness and better grip, if Beau moved even slightly, my boot could easily get caught in the stirrup. Plus, the ground can be slick. Enjoy winter riding – but be safe.

UNWRITTEN RILES OF THE BACK COUNTRY (HORSEMEN)

Not all the rules for any job, trade or recreational activity are written. Some of the most important rules are the ones that are not written. Here are some of my thoughts. But maybe they are just my pet peeves.

- 1. Mutual respect. Such as ...leave someone else's horses and tack alone. Or... Don't saddle another's horse unless you're asked. And do it their way or leave it alone. This one's more important than you might think, and everyone has their own way of doing it that usually works for them: or they wouldn't be doing it that way in the first place. They are NOT just doing it wrong. Listen to an explanation why another person does something a different way. Remember, it's hard to learn something when you already know everything! Every time I pack with someone new, I learn a different way to do something.
- 2. Pull your weight. Respect is earned.
- 3. Don't take your rules from the city or from any other place to the back country.
- 4. a. Hit the headfirst. Self-explanatory.
- 4. b. And dig a cat hole if at all possible! No one likes to see your business in the back country. Or it's wrappers!
- 5. If you're borrowing it for the third or fourth time, you need to buy your own!
- 6. Respect others' pace when you're in large groups. SEE #1 above. Slow it down if you have to. This becomes harder as groups increase in size, and with riders and horses of varying riding and fitness levels. Maybe consider it a personal challenge in horsemanship to match another's pace.
- 7. Practice "Situational Awareness." Be aware of your surroundings. I know it's tough after long hot summer days working at altitude when we're clearing trail or packing. My "near misses" have usually been when I'm dog tired late in the afternoon and then relax my attention or awareness.
- 8. Uphill has the right of way. (I'm pretty sure this one is written somewhere many somewheres probably.)
- 9. Everybody needs a sharp knife. NO EXCEPTIONS. On their person! All the time. No other explanation needed. (Preferably straight blade but personally I'll spot you that if you're handy with a knife.)

Maybe I should have titled this "Mostly Unwritten Rules" – I'm sure I've come across some of these ideas somewhere along the way. Maybe you've heard the expression "not in my job description." Maybe it should be.

I think that I see a lot of mutual respect among the members of this club. And I have appreciated the courtesy, help, experience, knowledge, and instruction I've received from members of this club in the last 6 years. If you have some other thoughts, I'm sure we would all like to hear them.


John Chepulis moved that Keith Brighton be a State Board Director Alternate by acclimation. Randy Thomsen second. Motion passed.

Melissa Codner moved that White Elephant gifts will be given out by the membership at the Christmas party. Nancy Thomsen second. Motion passed.


