Royal Tine Pack School 3-Day Packing Course - \$750

2023 Dates: June 16-18 or June 23-25

How many times have you wanted to ride into the backcountry for several days to hunt or simply enjoy mother nature, but didn't know how to undertake this "monumental" task? This short class will give you the skills to do just that. This class is for both beginner or intermediate packers. The class will include lots of hands on packing with gentle mules as well as lecture type sessions where you'll learn important tips on how to have a fun, safe and successful pack trip. Classes are small so you'll have lots of personal time with us, your instructors. Special requests and questions are welcome. Whether you have packed a lot and are just looking to improve or whether you have never packed at all, this class would be beneficial to anyone looking to learn or improve their skills.

Classes are held outside of Philipsburg, MT in the foothills of the Anaconda Pintlar Wilderness. Lodging and meals are included. Students stay in wall tents with a wood stove and comfy cots and foam mattresses. All meals are hearty homestyle, just like in the backcountry. At the end of the class we will put some short mule strings together with various loads and go for a ride (*250 pound rider limit for Sunday ride.)

- Gear list
- Saddling and parts identification
- Fitting the packsaddle
- Mantying loads for the Decker, and more!

HB261 INFORMATION

House Bill 261 was introduced by Steve Gunderson and a large number of backcountry non-profits, much like the Beartooth Back Country Horsemen, and public land managers are firmly against it. This bill's wording is incredibly confusing as to where the eBikes are allowed to go, and if passed we will definitely see an increase of eBikes on our trails. Under this bill the eBikes would be allowed in local and state jurisdictions but illegal on forest service land. Many of these trails start on local/state trails and end on the forest service. 
2023 BCHMT Convention: April 14th – 16th, Kalispell, Montana

2023, marks the 50th anniversary of the Back Country Horsemen, which started in the Flathead Valley of Montana and has since spread to 210 chapters in 32 states throughout the U.S. The anniversary event will be held at Majestic Valley Arena in Kalispell on April 14-16. The event will draw horsemen from the valley, as well as from all over the state of Montana and across the country.

Meeting called to order at 7:15 pm at Columbus Chamber of Commerce

John Jenkins moved to approve December minutes, Bob Knutson second. Motion passed.

President's report - Received a thank you note from the Nussbaum family for the card.

Vice Pres. Report – Commend John Chepulis on his work with the volunteer hours report. Our chapter is still in the top 25% of chapters in Montana for volunteer hours from last year. This year Dave Heinle volunteered to take charge of compiling our chapter hours, mileage, and people for our projects.

Education – Melissa provided a chart to document speakers for meetings and projects for the year. Ben Daley will be contacted to see if he will speak at the January meeting. Lee Schmelzer will be asked to speak in February or March on equine nutrition. Other people for upcoming meetings included Stewart to speak on bears and Stovall about brand inspections.

Communication – The board hasn't found anyone to take over the newsletter. Melissa Codner has the jump drive from Robin with the newsletter format on it.

John Jenkins moved to provide Jessi Erickson a complimentary family membership for her continued work on our website. Keith Brighton second. Motion passed

Discussion about using Gaggle Email to distribute the newsletter, having different people do the newsletter each month, and password protection for newsletter.

Activities – Renting the Meyers CK cabin for a mid to late August rendezvous. Discussion about holding it on the West Fork of the Boulder. Board members will ask at the next general meeting for input. State Board members will ask at next State meeting about holding an outreach meeting to recruit new members in Big Timber area.

Discussion about Spring Clinic as a get together because we do not plan to have a formal Defensive Horseman program this year. Defensive horseman can be done online and a brief discussion with skills check can be performed at a trail head by a competent instructor.

Issues – The State board had discussion about the Crazy Mountain land swaps that are proposed. Discussion about the Loop Trail and Rock Ck Trail.

Old Business – The board discussed some issues with the Christmas party.

New Business – Open Board seat. Dave Edwards is not interested in filling it due to other commitments. John Jenkins moved to appoint Sean Chepulis to the open board seat to fill the remainder of Ray Longstreath's seat for 1 year. Dave Heinle second. Motion passed.

Discussion on when to meet with the USFS and who would like to attend. Plan to get together with USFS in February or March. Dave Heinle will contact the USFS and set up the meeting to discuss their plans and ours for this year. He volunteered to be the contact person with the USFS for this year.

John Jenkins volunteered to be the contact between our club and the Absaroka Beartooth Wilderness Foundation (ABW)

Randy Thomsen will update our list of directors with the Back Country of Montana for this year.

Discussion on our club goals for the year to increase membership.

State Board update – Finances are in good standing, a lawyer has been retained to work on the "Light On the Land" program. Dues to the state will be going up in 2024. A new chainsaw and crosscut saw program is being worked on that will be more extensive. Defensive Horseman is also being revised.
