MINUTES - APRIL 6, 2023- BBCH BOARD MEETING

In attendance: Melissa Codner, Sean Chepulis, Bob Knutson, Dave Heinle, Laura O'Connor, Randy Thomsen.

Meeting called to order at 7:25 pm.

Bob Knutson moved to approve the March minutes with changes, Dave Heinle second. Motion passed.

Presidents Report – Spoke with Allie (USFS) she gave us clarification on unauthorized trail clearing. We would not be covered under the agreement or workers compensation in the event of an accident. If we do some clearing on a trail ride we need to keep track of trees cut and mileage. The club will reimburse people who clear trails. There was discussion about club members that take on a "pet project". The club will reimburse them for mileage and stock use as long as we are aware of the project. Discussion about the Big Timber Canyon clearing Porcupine trail to Crandle Cabin. Forest Lake would be a better location to clear.

Vice Presidents Report – Nothing at this time.

Treasurer Report - Included report, all info for the license plates has been sent and received by the state. Fire hall has been paid \$150 for use of the meeting hall. Proposed budget included and reviewed. Still need to contact the bank to update the signature card.

Dave Heinle moved to approve the budget. Bob Knutson second. Motion passed.

Education – Talked about schedule for Clyde Park. Friday is arrival day any time. Saturday and Sunday will be filled with small groups of people and a leader for each. Basic horsemanship and packing will be presented by a member. The presenters will switch groups each day to provide their own method on packing to give the group different options on packing. Dave Heinle will pick up the food for the weekend. The club will pay for dinner on Friday and Saturday evening and a continental style breakfast on Saturday and Sunday. We will need to send an updated Defensive Horsemanship list to Allie for this year. Laura will check in with the livestock inspector (Stoval) to see about an upcoming meeting.

Communications – Larry Salazar emailed about getting the tack swap going. He would like to know a date we would like to have it on so he can start the process. Melissa will talk with Larry. Discussion about a Poker Ride. Tabled at this time. Discussion about the upcoming Meyers Ck gravel and trail clearing on May 6th. We would like to have 2 groups of people, 1 delivering the gravel up Meyers Ck, and the 2nd riding over Lodgepole to clear the lower Deer Ck trail to the cabin. This will depend on how many members commit to this project. Melissa will pick up the gravel bags from Allie (USFS)

Issues – Nothing at this time.

New Business – Absarokee Community Foundation has announced they have money available for projects in the area. Laura and Melissa will apply for a \$500 grant to help with projects in the area. Discussion about a parking lot at the Ernie Strum trailhead. Northwest Energy had offered to allow a parking lot to be built on their powerline land. Dave Heinle will contact them to see if this is still an option. If it is, we will work on getting a grant from Absarokee Community Foundation to help pay for the cost of construction of said lot. This would become a multi-year project.

Reminder that trail project leaders are responsible to get signatures and mileage for the projects that they are leading. Turn in the hours and mileage to Dave Heinle. He will be the contact for this.

Discussion about State Convention and delegates. Talked about the resolution that will be voted on at the convention.

Audit will take place in May.

Meeting Adjourned at 8:38 pm
