If you didn't get your copies let me know will send by email.



- 1. Lack of pack support: the position backing up the lead packer has been open far too long and needs to be filled.
- 2. Need to move resources back into trail support instead of into fire management.
- 3. Greg Schatz introduced two women who have taken pack instruction through the Youth program sponsored by BCH and are enthusiastic about this activity: Greg made the point that without trails to be on, what is the future of teaching youth about the value of being in the wilderness let alone learning pack skills.

Good representation from various state chapters of BCH and there was a rep from the National Wilderness Society which is based out of Bozeman. Good food was served as always and we admired all the beautiful equines who were there to take people into the Scapegoat for the next few days.
