Mandy Alvino, Recreation Program Lead, from the Helena National Forest, Helena and Townsend Ranger Districts:

Current chainsaw and crosscut certifications are valid through September 2021

Mandy spoke about basic chainsaw training May 14 beginning at 9 a.m. for those needing new certifications. Better to bring your own equipment. The FS realizes there is a backlog of training needs. They are working on filling training needs for chainsaw, crosscut and CPR trainings.

There is a planned 2021 work project mid to late July to pack planks for a foot and stock bridge near Duck Creek Pass & Mt Baldy close to where trail 150 meets trail 151. Expected packing needs of 24 to 30 planks (2" * 10" * 48"). This is about a 4-mile one-way trip leaving from Thompson Guard Station. We would approach the trailhead from White Sulphur Spring side of the mountain.

Mandy A also stated carry permits are completed for those who sent in their information to the LEO for background checks. Notices – letters should be coming soon.

LCBCH National Trails Day will target Gates of the Mountains Wilderness Area, June 5 & 6. Setting up camp June 4 at Hunter's Gulch TH near the creek. Nicole A's dad, Carl has offered to do evening cooking of ribs for at least one night or more if needed. Nicole and Carl will work with Darlene for food order. There will be an RSVP sent to help with amount of food needed.

Mandy A added that the Volunteer Agreement provides Workers Compensation to the volunteers working with the LCBCH, thus the need for certification.

Dennis M shared with the group, the collaboration with other groups expressing similar concerns about proposed mechanized use changes in the Elkhorns and other public lands. A letter is circulating for a finalized draft that will or could be signed by the LCBCH by the end of May.

Next meeting will be held at Hunter's Gulch TH as part of the National Trails Day.

Meeting adjourned outside for packing demonstrations.
