I renewed the #5322 CD for only 9 months due to interest rates are supposed to rise. #5322 deposit was \$10,599.71. Original deposit was \$10,560.02. I ordered club checks for the amount of \$24.75.

**First Aid/CPR:** Saturday April 23<sup>rd</sup> from 11:30-4:30 at the Helena Ranger District/Supervisors Office in the same room we have been meeting in. Connie Long will be coming from Missoula. Tooth floating: With the recent retirement of one of a lot of our long-time vets and rising costs on everything, some people were concerned about getting their equines teeth floated. Lynda Wiles contacted a long-time equine dentist out of Lewistown to see if he would be willing to come to Helena for a day. He said he is more than willing and just needs a date, number of animals and place. Myself and several other members have used him before and were highly impressed with the way he handled the animals and his old-school no drug method. He charges \$120 per animal. If you have equines that need their teeth floated please contact Lynda at lyndawiles@msn.com so we can get number of animals and try to see what kind of facility we may need. We were thinking early May and maybe we could combine it with some sort of other club activity.

Wear and tear on vehicles gets expensive and some minor stipend to keep things running while still doing our volunteer work seems appropriate.
