The local USFS office prepared a supporting letter to the nomination. 2024 was the 75th Anniversary of the historic Mann Gulch fire. BCHA board members met mid-April 2025 and selected our nomination. Congrats to our chapter! Katy D will pick up our award/trophy at the state board meeting mid-May. I will share the nomination documents.
