

BEAR SPRAY TRAINING BY MACK LONG

Check the expiration date of your bear spray. If you meet a bear – never look it in the eyes!!! In a calm voice (as calm as possible) talk to the bear all the while backing away. If that doesn't work – use the bear spray. Will need to remove the safety catch. Spray in 4-6 second bursts low enough to the ground so that the bear has to travel through the fog. Highly recommend training/practice session so that you are comfortable with what you are doing. We held a practice session in the Parking lot of the VFW. Very good class – THANK-YOU MACK!

Mission Valley Back Country Horsemen Ride Safety Rules

- Please be sure to sign the release waiver before mounting
- All riders are asked to be mounted & ready to ride at the scheduled departure time
- Ride leader (s) will be appointed for each ride, & will be responsible for planning the route and departure time
- Riders are asked to stay behind the leader(s) during the ride
- When (if) it is necessary to dismount, all riders must wait until everyone is mounted again before continuing the ride
- Neither Stallions or Dogs will be allowed on any MVBCH ride
- Keep adequate distance between riders while on the ride
- • MVBCH does not permit smoking while riding
- Human & Equine First Aid Equipment will be with the Ride Leaders
- We ask that all riders be courteous when meeting others while riding
- Only one (1) rider per horse on any MVBCH sponsored ride
- It is the recommendation of the MVBCH Board of Directors that all persons under the age of 18 wear safety helmets

Trail Work News

Trails Summary - Laura Nelson

This year has been a busy year in preparing for the trail cleaning season. The Forest Service has implemented some new requirements in order to be covered under their Workman's Comp insurance. These requirements involve certification in Chain Saw safety & operation, First Aid/CPR, and Defensive Horsemanship. All sawyers have to have all three certifications. With this training we have a Volunteer Agreement attached to our Challenge Cost Share Agreement that will cover any of our sawyers should there be an accident while clearing trail.

* **SAW TRAINING:** The book session was held at the Hall Residence March 13-2015 and was taught by Forest Service Sawyers Tao Dejango and Josh. It was a six hour session that included a lot of safety in regards to protective gear, how to safely operate a saw, and what to look for in various cutting situations. The next day we all met at Patrick Creek on the \$t Regis cut-off for the field session. Here, everyone had the opportunity to practice what we had learned the day before. Everyone that participated went through actually falling a tree. Louis was very excited because he learned something knew - the quarter cut! We are all certified as S-12 sawyers and this certification is good for three years. Ten members of the club went through this training. Tao and Josh did an outstanding job and both had the patients of saints. They had to in order to put up with the likes of us!

* **DEFENSIVE HORSEMANSHIP:** This was held out at the Hahn residence March 21, 2015 and was instructed by our very own Mack & Connie Long, David Crawford, Carl Schauss, and Louis Polinsky. We had a total of 23 members participate in this course. Yes, everyone that took the saw training was here as well! A lot of this was review – but no matter what good review. I don't know about the rest of you, but I find I can become a little lax about things with my horses because I "TRUST" them. Always keep in mind, they have good and bad days just like the rest of us and that "Trust" can come back and bite you in the Butt if you aren't care-full! We reviewed the safety zone, proper bridling, saddling, how to tie some knots, hobbling, etc. It was an excellent course and we had a fantastic turnout for this. All of those who attended received a card. This training is good for two years.

* FIRST AID/CPR: This course was held at the Hall Residence April 18-2015 and was taught by Connie Long. Here we spent the day learning CPR and other First Aid techniques. We learned what to look for in the way of Medical emergencies such as Breathing problems, allergic reactions, heart attack/stoke, seizures, shock, heat related problems, burns, broken bones, bleeding/wounds etc. We learned how to assess both the scene and the patient. We reviewed items for first aid kits. It was a lot to take in in one day!! This class was the last step for Connie in obtaining her First Aide instructors certification. We had 15 club members that attended and received their First Aid/CPR card. This card is good for two years.

We have 10 members who are certified in all three areas. These members are Charley Hahn, Bill Dupuis, Carl Schauss, Louis Polinsky, Larry Ruffatto, Dan Hall, Scott Hopper, Scott Kiser, Paula Weaver, & Laura Nelson.

With the Training Complete and our Challenge Cost Share Agreement amended with a Volunteer Agreement we went to Cleaning Trails. Our Club is contracted to clean the River Trail, Flat Rock Trail & Boyd Mountain trail. Beth Kennedy met us at each trailhead providing the radios or swapping out the batteries on them. A Tailgate safety check was conducted at each trailhead as well. Just a note: Beth Kennedy is our new contact person out of the Superior Forest Service office. She has taken Carol Johnsons place. She is a great gal to work with!

* River Trail: May 10-Mother's Day We cleaned the River Trail coming in from both ends. This is usually the first trail of the season that we clean due to the Race that is usually held about the middle of the month. We had Carl & Dennese Schauss, Charley Hahn, & Sherri Hopper coming in from the St Regis end. At the Ferry Landing end we had Larry Ruffatto, Louis Polinsky, Jim & Doria Murphy, and Laura Nelson. Between both crews we removed about 15 trees from the trail. We met in the middle for some lunch and tall tales! Yeah Louis & Carl are pretty good at that! Sherri Hopper and Laura Nelson provided the pack animals for this trail. We topped off a great day on the trail with a nice meal at Quinn's Hot Springs. Good work, good food and good friends.

*Flat Rock Trail: Laura Nelson

This trail was cleaned June 6 coming in from both ends. Here again this trail wasn't in that bad of shape with the exception that it really needs to be brushed out. At the St Regis end we had Carl & Dennese Schauss, Sue Henderson, Charley Hahn, & Scott & Sherri Hopper. At the Camels Hump end we had Larry Ruffatto, Louis Polinsky, & Jim & Doria Murphy. Louis seems to think they cut about 25 trees on their end. Again they met in the middle for lunch and then headed back out the way they came. Scott Hopper and Jim Murphy provided the pack animals for this project.

* Boyd Mountain Trail: Carol McCrum

Boyd Mountain Trail clearing day promised to be great weather for getting our last of 3 trails cleared of dead fall. We had a slight breese and were in the shade the majority of the time (which made a big difference). There were 8 hardy souls that volunteered their time and muscle for this project. They were; Larry Ruffatto, Carol McCrum, Carl Schauss, Jim and Doria Murphy, Scott Hopper, Louie Polinsky and Charlie Hahn. Jim was kind enough to use his horse to pack our supplies. She did a heck of a good job! We counted a total of 68 trees that were moved or cut down. The trail was 7 1/2 miles each way. It took 5hours to cut the trail out. The crew started about 10:00am and did not get back to the trailers till about 4:00pm. Beth was starting to get just a little bit worried about them, but everyone returned safe and sound.

Your internal cooling system doesn't work as well as you age, so if you're feeling dizzy or light-headed and your skin is clammy, those are sure signs your becoming overheated. Immediately find shade an elevate your fee, then rehydrate with cool water. (Avoid ice water, which is not as easily absorbed.) Pouring cool water on your wrists and feet can also help lower your body temp more quickly.


Attend the October General Meeting for an informational talk about Back Country First Aid, presented by Dr. Michael Righetti. Dr. Righetti is a

Jim worked his way through yet school at Washington State University in Pullman as a packer for the Forest Service in the Idaho panhandle on the St. Joe Forest, picking up his stock at the remount in Perma and riding cross country to his work stations. 
